Census rehearsal: Anglesey 'silver surfers' embrace new online questionnaire

Sunday 11th October is 2009 Census Rehearsal day on Anglesey, and the community's 'silver surfers' are poised to test out the new secure online questionnaire.

Anglesey is one of just three areas in England and Wales taking part in the 2009 Census Rehearsal which will road test the new online questionnaire and the postal delivery of paper questionnaires planned for the 2011 Census.

One local resident keen to test the new online questionnaire is 70 year old Bill Hart and his wife Karleen (64) who grew up on the island. "We've been included in six census questionnaires in our lifetime, mostly as part of this community on Anglesey. I do a lot of work on the computer as part of my presidential duties for a charity, and Karleen uses it to book our holidays, so we're quite comfortable filling in the census online this time."

Like many other older residents in Holyhead, Bill and Karleen are regular visitors, and volunteers, at the Plas Cybi Partnership where local people can use the computer facilities. "There are always lots of 'silver

surfers' here and I'm sure many of them will do as we are and complete their rehearsal questionnaire online." continues Bill.

By filling in the questionnaire Bill and Karleen are also ensuring future generations of the family and genealogists are able to build a colourful and accurate picture of the past.

Peter Moore, census area manager for Anglesey said: "Information gathered from the census helps the government allocate funding to local authorities, and in turn helps local authorities decide where it is best spent. How many teachers and doctors are needed; plans for public transport; help with community projects like the Plas Cybi Partnership; they all depend on the number and type of people living there."

ONS Census Director Glen Watson, said: "Residents of Anglesey who are taking part in the rehearsal will by now have received their questionnaires. We would like everyone to fill them in on Sunday 11th October, or as soon as they can after, and then return them to us online or on paper as quickly as possible. This way we can effectively test the systems and processes we have in place and make sure we get it right in 2011."

Facts about the 2009 Census Rehearsal:

- The rehearsal is taking place in three areas - Lancaster, the London Borough of Newham and Ynys Môn – Isle of Anglesey
- In total, around 140,000 households in these areas will be asked to take part on Census Rehearsal Day, 11 October 2009
- These areas represent a cross-section of the population and include a broad range of housing types
- In parallel to the rehearsal a small scale test in Birmingham will be undertaken
- The small scale test in Birmingham will include 17,000 addresses and will utilise some of the procedures and processes being delivered within the rehearsal
- Everyone is asked the same questions on the same day in order to take a snapshot of the population at one moment
- The census is easy to fill in, confidential and can be filled in online for the first time
- The results from the rehearsal will not be published but used to improve procedures for 2011
- There are 57 questions in total, 14 are about the household and its accommodation and 43 questions are for each individual member of the household to complete
- Most questions can be answered by a simple tick
- Taking part in the 2009 Census Rehearsal and test in Birmingham is voluntary. Everyone will be obliged to take part in the 2011 Census
