## Before you start

#### What should you complete on this questionnaire?

There are 3 sections to complete:

**Household questions on pages 3-6** about your household. These are numbered H1 to H14. A 'household' is:

- one person living alone; or
- a group of people (not necessarily related) living at the same address who share cooking facilities and share a living room, sitting room or dining area

**Individual questions on pages 7-30** for every person who usually lives in this accommodation. There are individual questions numbered 1 to 43 for up to 6 people. Every person who has been, or intends to be, in the UK for 3 months or more should be included in these questions at their usual address.

**Visitor questions on the back page (page 32)** for all other people staying the night in this accommodation on 11 October 2009. There are visitor questions numbered V1 to V4 for up to 3 visitors.

It is important to include visitors staying overnight here on 11 October 2009 to make sure no-one is missed. Visitors who live elsewhere in the UK must also be included on the Census questionnaire at their usual address.

You will find further information for people with special circumstances on page 31: students/schoolchildren who live away from home, children with parents who live apart, lodgers, unrelated/shared households, people who live away from home while working, people temporarily away from home, people from outside the UK and absent households.

#### Will you need extra questionnaires?

- If there is more than one household at this address you need to request a separate Household Questionnaire
- If there are more than 6 people in your household, you can choose to either:
  - complete the entire questionnaire online, including everyone in your household; or
  - fill in this questionnaire and request a Continuation Questionnaire for the additional people
- If any members of this household wish to fill in Individual questions (1 to 43) separately, you can request Individual Questionnaires, which may be completed on paper or online

## Information for special circumstances

# Students/schoolchildren who live away from home

All students or schoolchildren who live away from home need to be included on the Census questionnaires at both their home and term-time addresses.

- At their home address they must be included in Household questions (H1 to H3 and H6) and Individual questions (1 to 6)
- At their term-time address they must be included in Household questions (H1 to H3 and H6) and Individual questions (1 to 43)

### Children with parents who live apart

Children with parents who live apart should be included as a household member on the Census questionnaire for the address where they spend the majority of their time. They should be included in Household questions (H1 to H3 and H6) and Individual questions (1 to 43).

If they are staying overnight at another address on 11 October 2009 they must also be included as a visitor on the questionnaire for that address in Household questions (H4 to H5) and Visitor questions (V1 to V4).

If they live equally between 2 addresses they should be included as a household member in Household questions (H1 to H3 and H6) and Individual questions (1 to 43) at the address where they are actually staying overnight on 11 October 2009.

### Lodgers

Lodgers who live solely at their lodging address should be included as a household member in Household questions (H1 to H3 and H6) and Individual questions (1 to 43) on the questionnaire where they lodge.

People who only lodge part-time, for example for work, should be included on the Census questionnaire at their home address in Household questions (H1 to H3 and H6) and Individual questions (1 to 43). If they are staying overnight at their lodging address on 11 October 2009 they must also be included as a visitor on the questionnaire for that address in Household questions (H4 to H5) and Visitor questions (V1 to V4).

#### Unrelated/shared households

One of the householders / tenants must complete Household questions (H1 to H14) and ensure Individual questions (1 to 43) are completed for each household member. These may be completed separately by requesting an Individual Questionnaire.

# People who live away from home while working

People who live away from home while working in the UK must be included as a household member on the Census questionnaire at their home address in Household questions (H1 to H3 and H6) and Individual questions (1 to 43).

If they are staying overnight at their second UK address on 11 October 2009 they must also be included as a visitor on the questionnaire for that address in Household questions (H4 to H5) and Visitor questions (V1 to V4).

Household questions (H7 to H14) must be completed on the guestionnaire at their second address.

#### People temporarily away from home

Anyone who is temporarily away from their permanent or family home on 11 October 2009 should be included as a household member at their home address. This includes people who are:

- living away from home while working in the UK
- members of the Armed Forces
- staying at their second address
- on holiday or travelling (unless outside the UK for 12 months or more)
- visiting friends or relatives
- living, or expecting to live, in a residential establishment (such as a hospital, care home or hostel) for less than 6 months
- in prison on remand (for any length of time), or sentenced to less than 6 months' imprisonment

### People from outside the UK

People from outside the UK whose total length of stay in the UK will be 3 months or more should be included on the Census questionnaire where they usually stay. They should be included in Household questions (H1 to H3 and H6) and Individual questions (1 to 43).

If their total length of stay is less than 3 months they should only be included as a visitor on the questionnaire at the address where they are staying overnight on 11 October 2009 in Household questions (H4 to H5) and Visitor questions (V1 to V4).

#### **Absent households**

If this address is unoccupied overnight on 11 October 2009 because the whole household is away, the questionnaire should be completed as soon as possible upon their return.
