Index of Services, UK: September 2023

Movements in the volume of output for the UK services industries. Figures are seasonally adjusted.



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1. Main points

- We estimate that monthly services output increased by 0.2% in September 2023; this follows an increase of 0.3% in August 2023 (downwardly revised by 0.1 percentage points).
- The Index of Services (IoS) saw monthly increases in 8 of the 14 sectors in September 2023; the largest positive contributing sectors to the monthly growth in September 2023 were "human health" (1.0%) and " professional, scientific and technical activities" (0.8%).
- The monthly September 2023 rise was partially offset by falls in "wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles" and "real estate activities", which saw decreases of 0.4% and 0.2%, respectively.
- Looking at the longer-term, we estimate that quarterly services output growth in Quarter 3 (July to Sept) 2023 fell by 0.1% when compared with Quarter 2 (Apr to June) 2023; this follows no growth (0.0%) in Quarter 2 2023.
- The main negative contributing sectors over Quarter 3 2023 were "real estate activities" and "transportation and storage", which fell by 0.4% and 1.2%, respectively; these declines were partially offset by " professional, scientific and technical activities", which grew by 0.6%.

3. Measuring the data

Data sources and collection

The Index of Services (IoS) is compiled using data from several different sources (share of overall economy based on latest gross value added (GVA) weights):

- Office for National Statistics (ONS) Monthly Business Survey (34.1%)
- ONS Retail Sales Inquiry (4.9%)
- ONS Government Expenditure (14.8%)
- ONS Households' Expenditure (11.5%)
- ONS Finance Expenditure (5.7%)
- ONS households and non-profit institutions serving households (1.9%)
- Other (4.4%)

The Monthly Business Survey (MBS) data are published alongside this release inour <u>MBS turnover of services</u> industries dataset.

Data relating to the retail industry are broadly comparable withour <u>Retail sales</u>, <u>Great Britain</u>: <u>October 2023 bulletin</u>, published on 20 October 2023.

Additional bank holiday in May 2023 for the Coronation of King Charles III

There was an additional bank holiday for the coronation of King Charles III on Monday 8 May 2023. While adjustments are made for regular calendar effects, there was no explicit adjustment for this event. However, the timing of the bank holiday indirectly affects the number of trading days, which could affect GDP estimates positively or negatively, depending on the sector. This should be taken into account when interpreting monthly, and three-month movements over recent months since May 2023.

Revisions to Index of Services

In line with our <u>National Accounts Revisions Policy</u>, this release gives data for September 2023 for the first time with July and August 2023 also open for revision.
