Consumer price inflation, UK: July 2026

Price indices, percentage changes, and weights for the different measures of consumer price inflation.

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1 . Main points

- The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) rose by 3.1% in the 12 months to July 2026, up from 2.8% the previous month.
- On a monthly basis, CPIH rose by 0.3% in July 2026, having been little changed in July 2025.
- The Consumer Prices Index (CPI) rose by 2.9% in the 12 months to July 2026, up from 2.6% the previous month.
- On a monthly basis, CPI rose by 0.3% in July 2026, compared with a rise of 0.1% in July 2025.
- Housing and household services, and furniture made the largest upward contributions to the monthly change in both CPIH and CPI annual rates; transport made the largest, partially offsetting, downward contribution.
- Core CPIH (CPIH excluding energy, food, alcohol and tobacco) rose by 2.9% in the 12 months to July 2026, up from 2.8% in June; the CPIH goods annual rate rose from 1.7% to 2.2%, while the CPIH services annual rate was unchanged, at 3.6%.
- Core CPI (CPI excluding energy, food, alcohol and tobacco) rose by 2.6% in the 12 months to July 2026, unchanged from the 12 months to June; the CPI goods annual rate rose from 1.7% to 2.2%, while the CPI services annual rate eased from 3.6% to 3.4%.

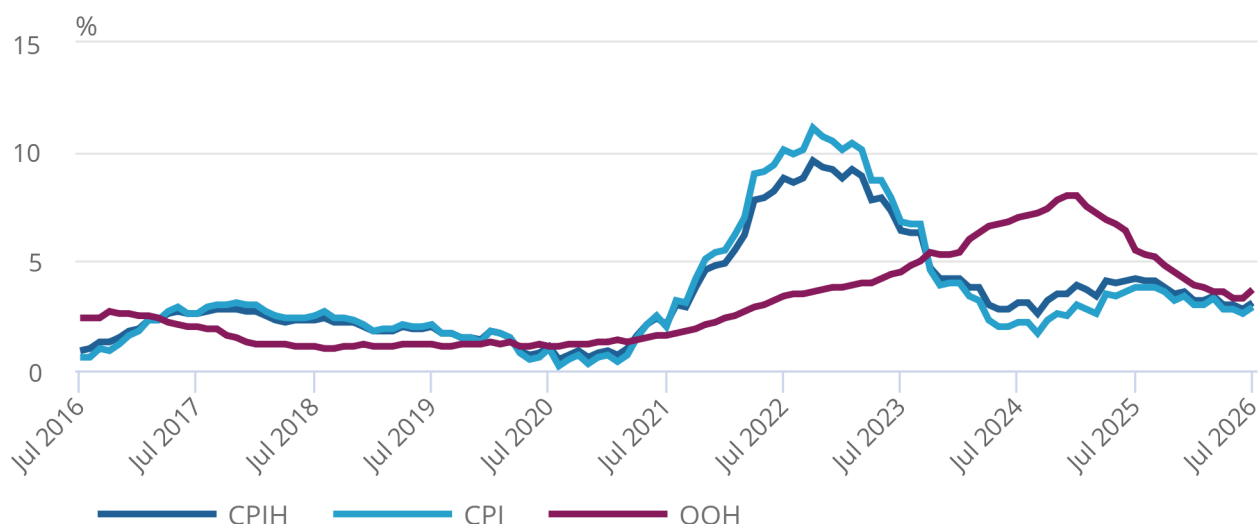

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) rose by 3.1% in the 12 months to July 2026, up from 2.8% the previous month (Figure 1). This was the first time since March 2026 that the 12-month rate had increased.

On a monthly basis, CPIH rose by 0.3% in July 2026, having been little changed in July 2025.

The Consumer Prices Index (CPI) rose by 2.9% in the 12 months to July 2026, up from 2.6% the previous month. This was the first time since March 2026 that the 12-month rate had increased.

On a monthly basis, CPI rose by 0.3% in July 2026, compared with a rise of 0.1% in July 2025.

The main drivers of the annual inflation rate for CPIH and CPI are the same where they are common to both measures. However, the owner occupiers' housing (OOH) costs component accounts for approximately 18% of the CPIH and is the main driver for differences between the CPIH and CPI inflation rates.

This makes CPIH our most comprehensive measure of inflation. We cover this in more detail in [Section 4: Latest movements in CPIH inflation](#) and provide a commentary on the CPI in [Section 5: Latest movements in CPI inflation](#). We also cover both CPIH and CPI in [Section 3: Notable movements in prices](#), though the figures reflect CPIH.

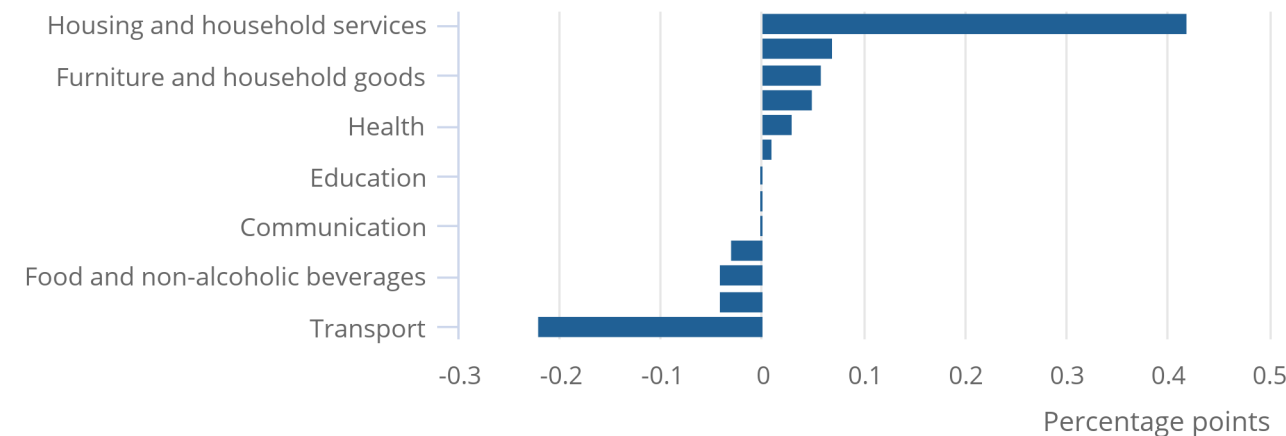

Figure 2 shows the contributions from the 12 divisions to the change in the annual Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) inflation rate between June and July 2026. These sum to the change in the annual rate, from 2.8% to 3.1%, between these months.

The increase in the 12-month rate between June and July 2026 reflected upward contributions from five divisions, partially offset by downward contributions from four divisions. The largest upward contribution came from housing and household services, particularly gas and electricity. The largest offsetting downward contribution came from transport.

Housing and household services

The 12-month rate for housing and household services was 4.1% in July 2026, up from 2.7% in June. Prices rose by 0.9% in the month to July 2026, compared with a fall of 0.4% a year ago.

The rise in the 12-month rate between June 2026 and July 2026 reflected an upward effect from gas, where prices rose by 14.7% in July 2026 compared with a fall of 7.2% a year ago.

The rise in prices came mainly from changes to standard variable tariffs, where there was a [change in the Office of Gas and Electricity Markets \(Ofgem\) energy price cap in July 2026](#). Ofgem estimated that for an average household paying by direct debit for dual fuel, this equates to an annual bill of £1,862, which is a rise of £221.

The price cap rose in part because of higher wholesale energy prices. The 12-week assessment period used by Ofgem to calculate the July to September 2026 (Quarter 3) price cap was from 18 February to 18 May 2026. This meant it was the first assessment period where prices had been affected by the outbreak of the conflict in the Middle East.

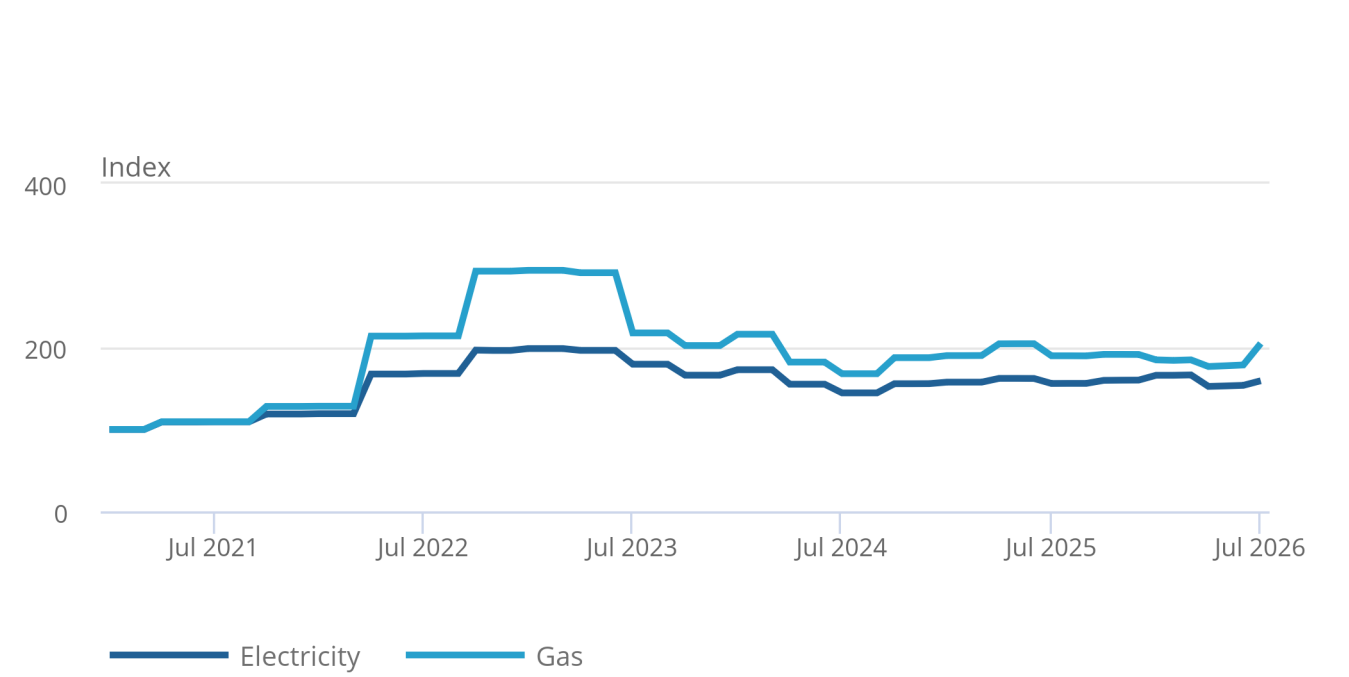
The increase was the largest rise in gas prices since October 2022, when UK consumers were initially exposed to the higher prices arising from the energy crisis relating to the war in Ukraine. The price rise this month means that gas prices are at their highest level since March 2024 (Figure 3).

The rise in the 12-month rate also reflected an upward effect from electricity, where prices rose by 3.6% in July 2026, compared with a fall of 3.8% a year ago.

Furniture and household goods

Prices of furniture and household goods overall rose by 1.0% in the 12 months to July 2026, compared with a fall of 0.2% in the 12 months to June. On a monthly basis, prices fell by 0.4% in July 2026, compared with a fall of 1.6% a year ago. While prices tend to fall in July, this was the smallest fall in prices in July since 1989.

The rise in the 12-month rate resulted principally from prices of furniture and furnishings falling in July 2026, but by less than a year ago. There were smaller upward contributions from tools and equipment for house and garden, and goods and services for routine household maintenance.

Clothing and footwear

Clothing and footwear prices rose by 0.5% in the 12 months to July 2026, compared with a fall of 0.5% the previous month.

On a monthly basis, prices fell by 0.9% in July 2026, compared with a larger fall of 1.9% in July 2025. The fall of 0.9% was the smallest fall in prices in July since 2020.

The [ONS Retail Sales Index \(RSI\) bulletin](#) from June reported that discounting on clothing started earlier than usual this year and that the quantity bought in clothing stores rose by 1.9%, the largest monthly rise since September 2025. The rise in volumes was attributed to a boost from sales promotions and the warm weather.

The findings from the RSI bulletin are reflected in the CPI dataset, as the proportion of discounted items of clothing fell between June and July this year, contrasting with a rise in the same period last year.

Some [recent media reports](#) have also suggested that the warm weather in July led people to spend more on clothing than might otherwise have been the case.

Transport

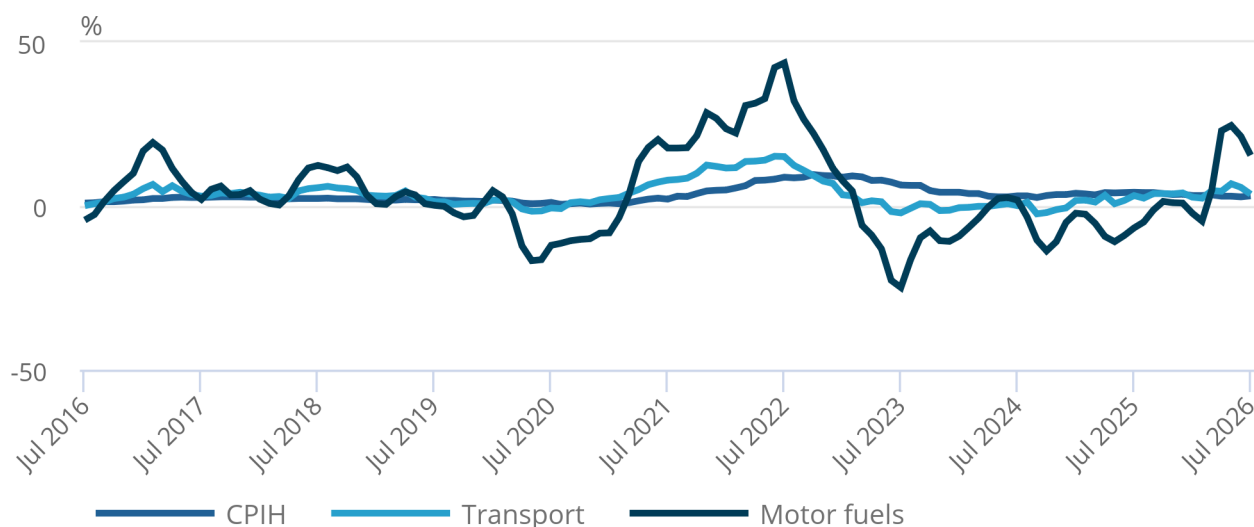
Prices in the transport division rose overall by 3.6% in the 12 months to July 2026, down from 5.7% the previous month (Figure 4). On a monthly basis, prices rose by 0.2% in July 2026, compared with a rise of 2.2% a year ago.

The largest downward effect behind the slowing in the transport annual rate came from motor fuels, particularly diesel. The average price of diesel fell by 8.8 pence per litre between June and July 2026, compared with a rise of 2.9 pence per litre between June and July 2025. The average price stood at 167.6 pence per litre in July 2026.

Petrol prices fell by 3.1 pence per litre in July 2026, compared with a rise of 2.0 pence per litre in July 2025. The average price stood at 152.2 pence per litre in July 2026.

These movements resulted in overall motor fuel prices rising by 15.5% in the 12 months to July 2026, compared with a rise of 21.3% in the 12 months to June.

Air fares rose by 11.7% between June and July 2026, compared with a rise of 30.2% between the same two months in 2025. The downward effect from air fares came almost entirely from European routes, where prices fell by 4.3% compared with a 38% rise in July 2025. This is in contrast to long-haul flights, which rose by 31.7% compared with a rise of 20.9% a year ago.

Recent reports in the media have provided insight into the possible reasons for this contrast. Many airlines have [suspended or reduced flights into Middle Eastern airports](#) because of the armed conflict and it has been suggested that the resulting reduction in capacity has led to [large price increases in long-haul fares](#).

The cost of jet fuel could also be a factor as long-haul flights are more fuel-intensive than short-haul flights because they make use of [larger and more heavy aircraft](#) that begin their journey with a greater weight because of the [additional fuel they carry](#). And the [disrupted airspace across parts of the Middle East has also forced carriers to reroute planes](#), something that is not necessary for short-haul European flights.

Short-haul prices could have fallen because of a reported [fall in consumer demand](#), and the additional flexibility airlines have when managing short-haul flights could be an important factor. If a rise in input costs such as jet fuel results in a route becoming unprofitable, [one solution is to cancel flights on routes where airlines have multiple flights in a day](#), which results in the same level of demand being catered for at lower cost to the airline. However, this option is less viable for long-haul routes where airlines are less likely to have multiple daily flights to a destination.

All domestic and European flight prices were collected after the outbreak of the conflict in the Middle East on 28 February 2026. Long-haul flight prices collected three months and one month before departure were collected after the outbreak of the conflict, but long-haul flight prices collected six months before departure were collected before the outbreak of the conflict.

Food and non-alcoholic beverages

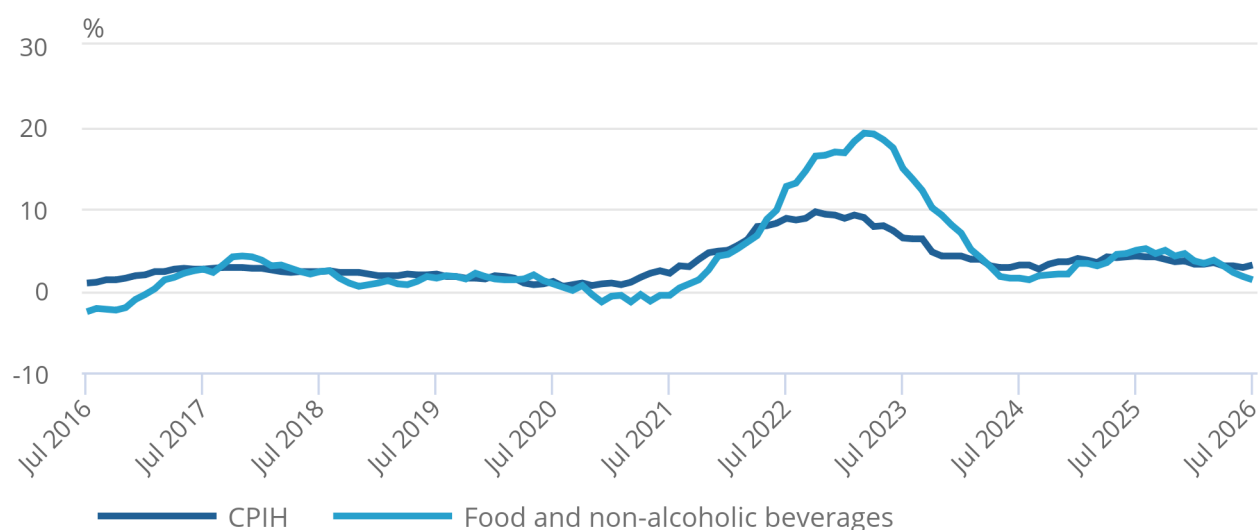
Food and non-alcoholic beverage prices rose by 1.3% in the 12 months to July 2026, down from 1.7% the previous month (Figure 5). The annual rate was last lower in September 2021, when it was 0.8%. On a monthly basis, food and non-alcoholic beverage prices were little changed in July 2026, compared with a rise of 0.4% a year ago.

There were small downward effects behind the change in the annual rate from 3 of the 11 detailed classes. The largest of these effects came from meat, particularly meat of cows, and breaded chicken. Prices in this class fell this year but rose last year, leading to a downward contribution of 0.02 percentage points to the change in the CPIH inflation rate.

Other slightly smaller downward effects came from vegetables, and from sugar, jam, honey, syrups, chocolate and confectionery. Prices of vegetables fell by more in July 2026 than they did in July 2025, and prices of sugar, jam and honey rose by less in July 2026 than they did last year. This led to a downward contribution of 0.01 percentage points to the change in the CPIH inflation rate from both these classes.

There were small upward effects from bread and cereals, and from fish. Prices of fish rose in July 2026 but fell in July 2025, while prices of bread and cereals rose in July 2026 but were little changed a year ago. This led to a small upward contribution of 0.01 percentage points to the change in the CPIH inflation rate from both of these classes.

The other six detailed classes within food and non-alcoholic beverages had little effect on the change in the headline rate. These were milk, cheese and eggs; fruit; oils and fats; other food products; hot beverages; and soft drinks.

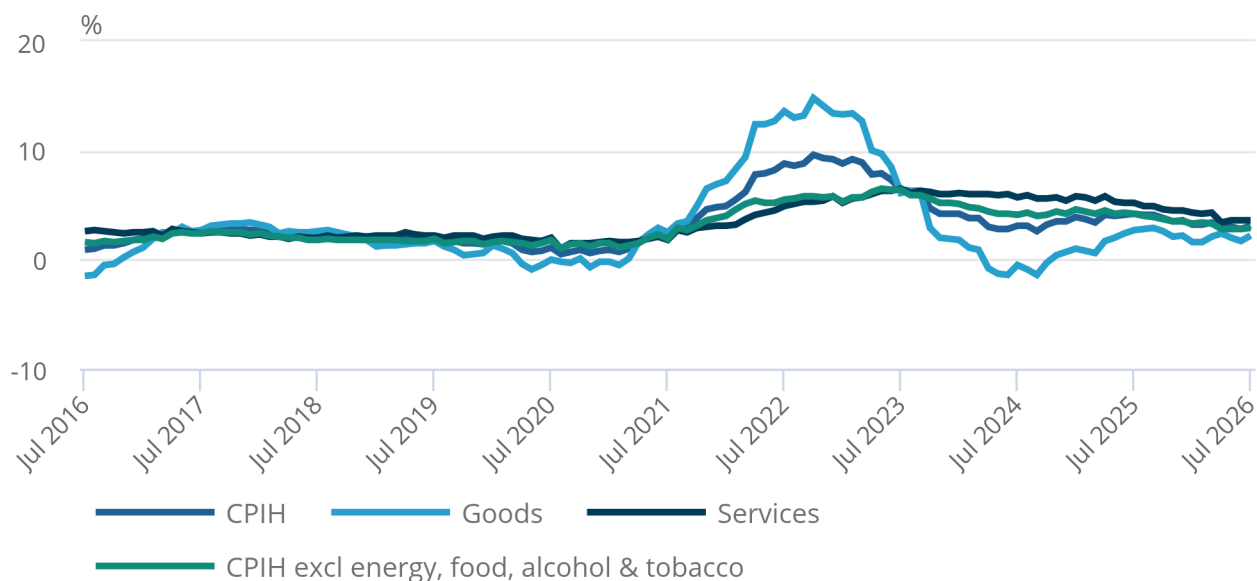
4 . Latest movements in CPIH inflation

Figure 6 shows the 12-month inflation rates for the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) series for all goods and all services, together with CPIH excluding energy, food, alcohol and tobacco (often referred to as core CPIH). The CPIH inflation rate is added for comparison.

The core CPIH annual inflation rate was 2.9% in July 2026, up from 2.8% in June. This was the first time since February 2026 that core CPIH has risen.

The CPIH all-goods index rose by 2.2% in the 12 months to July 2026, up from 1.7% the previous month. There were large upward contributions to the change in the annual rate from energy, particularly from gas and electricity. These were partially counteracted by a large downward contribution from motor fuels.

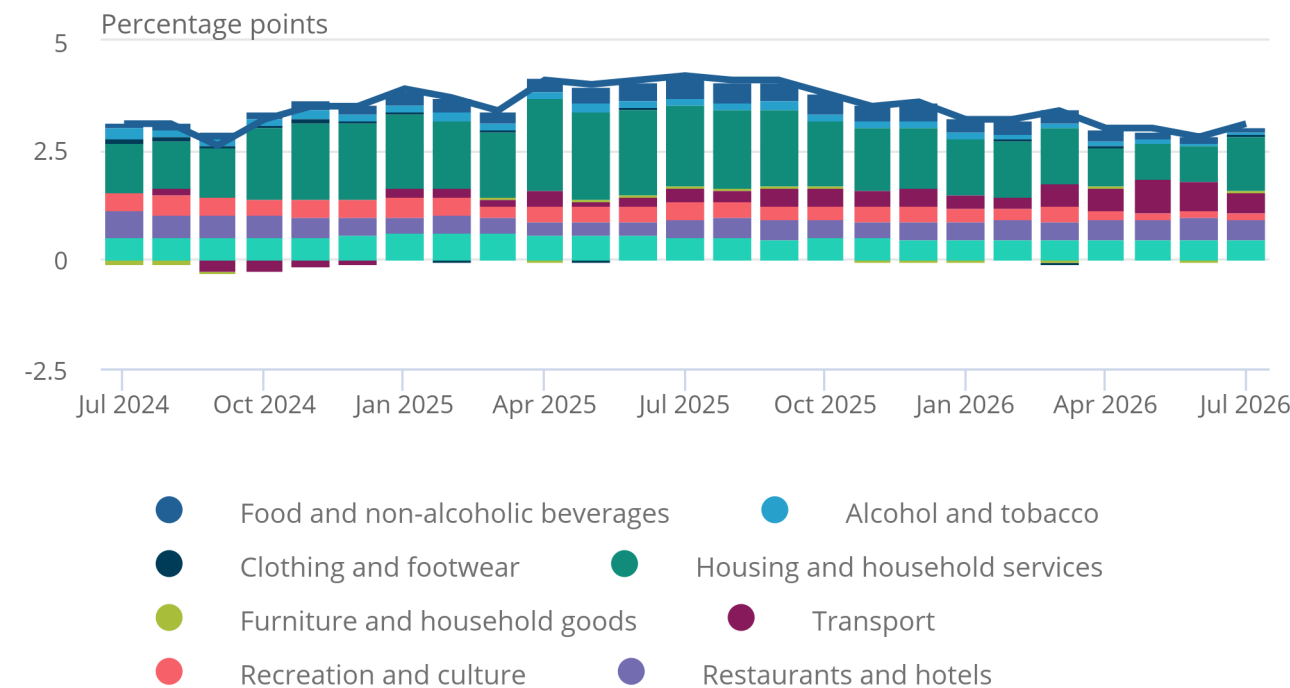
The CPIH all-services index rose by 3.6% in the 12 months to July 2026, unchanged from the 12 months to June. The upward and downward contributions to the change in the annual rate were mostly small and offset one another. The largest downward contribution came from airfares and the largest upward contributions came from owner-occupied housing costs, and actual rentals for housing.

Figure 7 shows the extent to which the distinct categories of goods and services have contributed to the overall annual CPIH inflation rate over the last two years. The contribution of each category to the annual rate depends on the price movement in that category and its weight, which is updated annually.

The contribution from food and non-alcoholic beverages was 0.12 percentage points, the smallest contribution since October 2021.

The largest positive contribution to the CPIH annual inflation rate came from housing and household services. The division has made the largest contribution for the last 25 months, starting from July 2024. However, its contribution has eased from a recent high in April 2025.

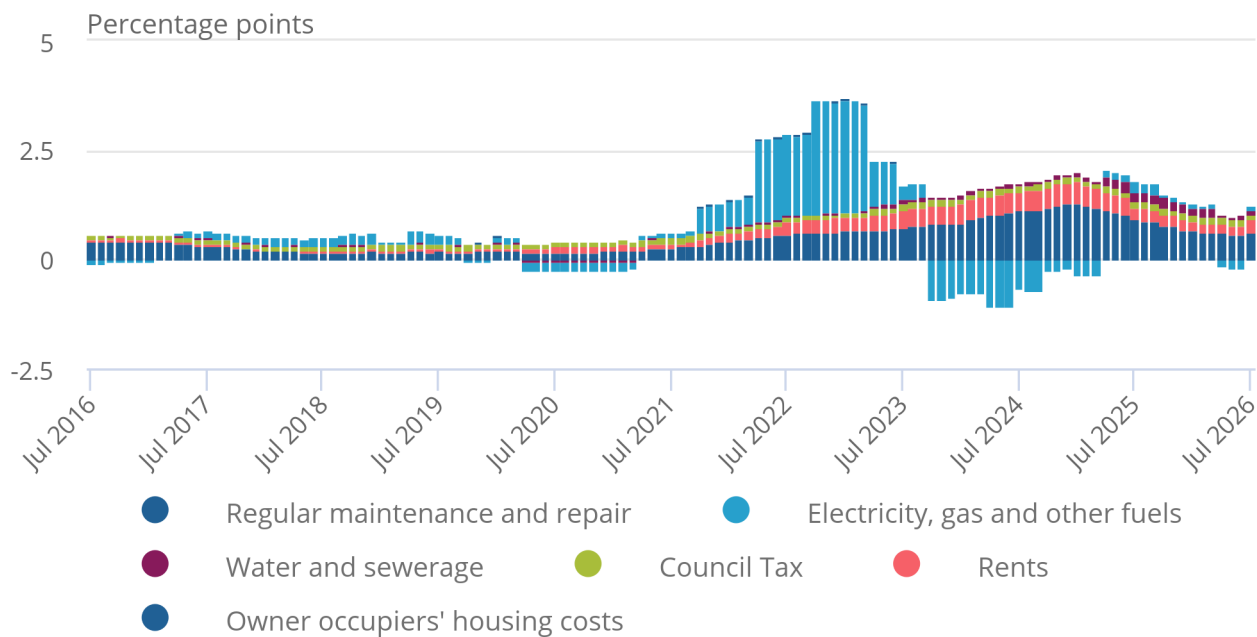
The contribution from recreation and culture was 0.17 percentage points, the smallest contribution since July 2021.

Figure 8 shows the contributions from owner occupiers' housing (OOH) costs and Council Tax to the annual CPIH inflation rate in the context of wider housing-related costs. The Consumer Prices Index (CPI) differs from the CPIH because it does not include these two components.

The annual contribution from OOH costs rose slightly, to 0.65 percentage points in July 2026. This was the second consecutive rise between months and followed 16 consecutive decreases. Although the current contribution was larger than the previous month's, it was smaller than the recent high of 1.31 percentage points in January 2025.

5 . Latest movements in CPI inflation

While the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is our most comprehensive measure of consumer price inflation, the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) is based on a harmonised methodology developed by Eurostat. This enables international comparisons to be drawn. It is also used to set the operational inflation target for UK monetary policy, and to uprate working-age benefits and tax credits. Figure 9 shows annual CPI inflation for the UK compared with the EU average and selected G7 countries. While the UK CPI is produced on a comparable basis with EU countries, the US Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) differs in some respects. More information is available in Note 1 to Figure 9.

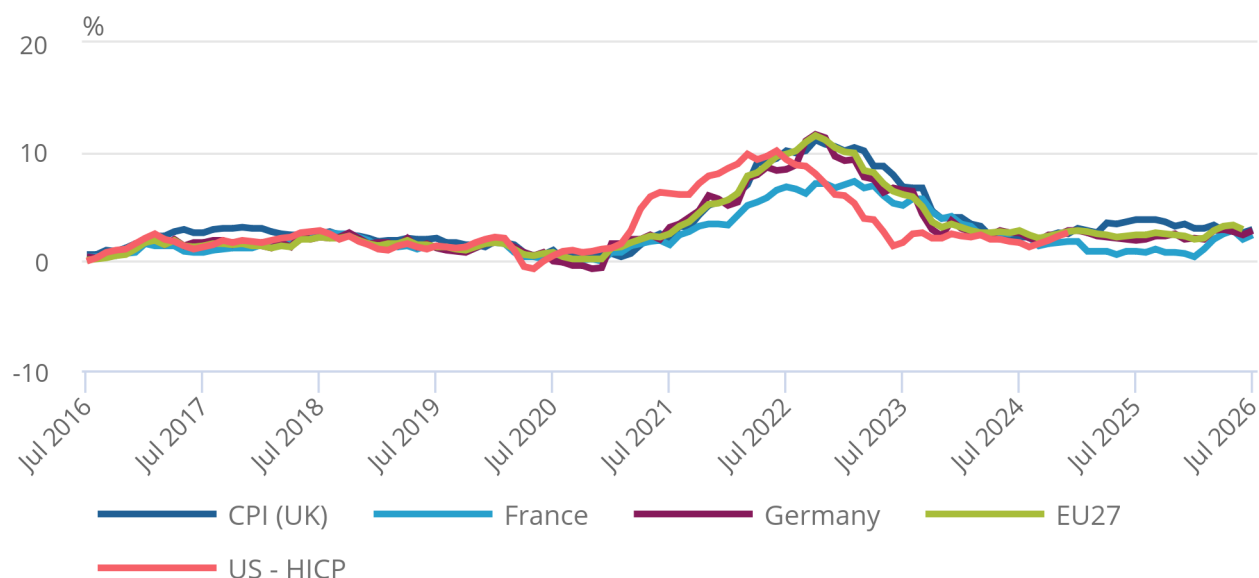
The UK's CPI inflation rate of 2.9% was higher than the first (or "flash") estimate of inflation for France (2.4%) and slightly above that for Germany (2.8%) in July 2026.

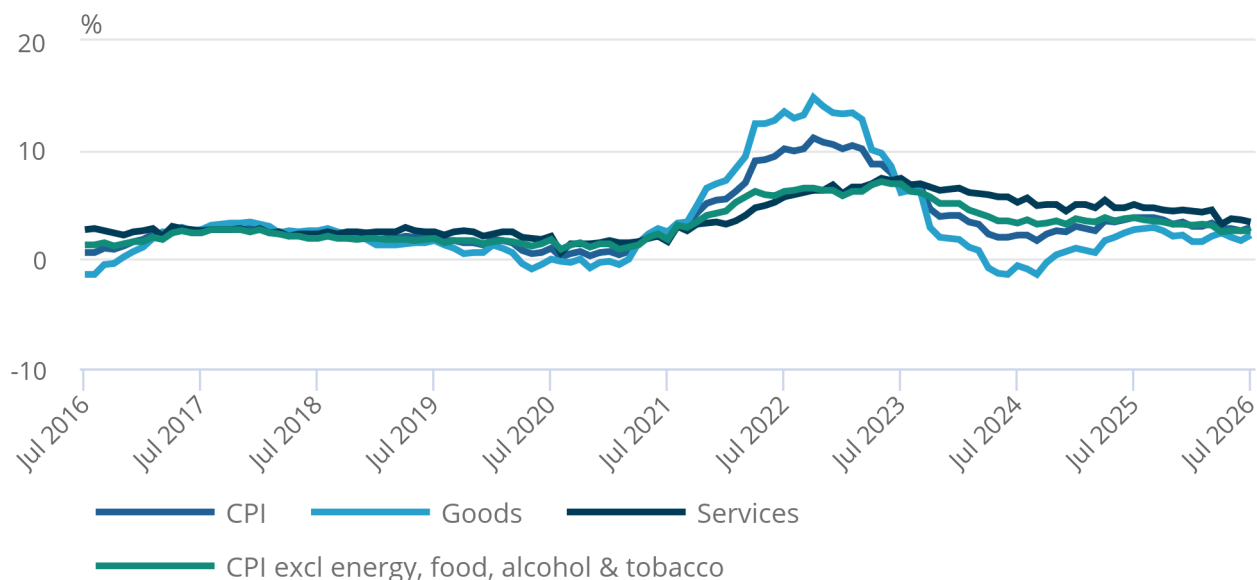

Figure 10 shows the 12-month inflation rates for the CPI all-goods and all-services series, together with CPI excluding energy, food, alcohol and tobacco (often referred to as core CPI). The headline CPI inflation rate is added for comparison.

The core CPI annual inflation rate was 2.6% in July 2026, unchanged from June.

The CPI all-goods index rose by 2.2% in the 12 months to July 2026, up from 1.7% the previous month.

The CPI all-services index rose by 3.4% in the 12 months to July 2026, down from 3.6% the previous month.

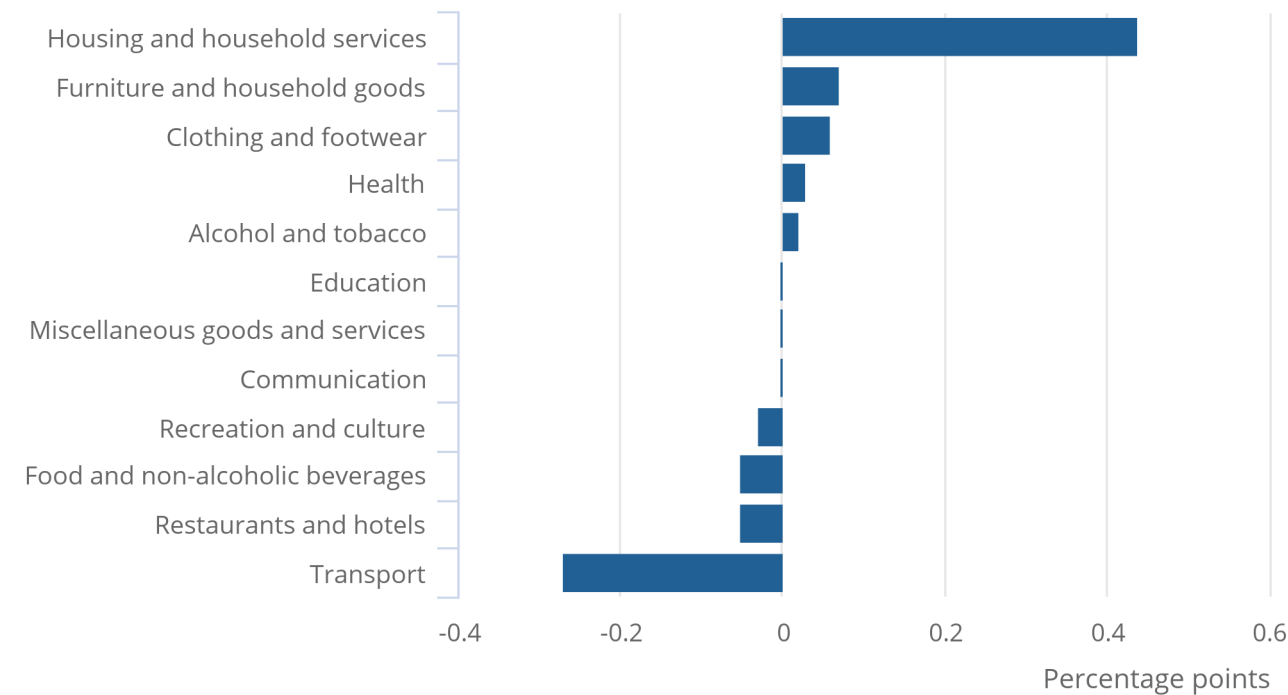
As with the all-items annual inflation rates, the drivers of CPIH and CPI goods and services inflation are the same (except for owner occupiers' housing (OOH) costs and Council Tax, which are excluded from CPI). Figure 11 shows how each of the main groups of goods and services contributed to the change in the CPI annual inflation rate between June and July 2026.

The rate's rise in July 2026 reflected upward contributions from five divisions, partially offset by downward contributions from four divisions. The largest upward contribution came from housing and household services, particularly gas and electricity. The largest downward contribution came from transport.

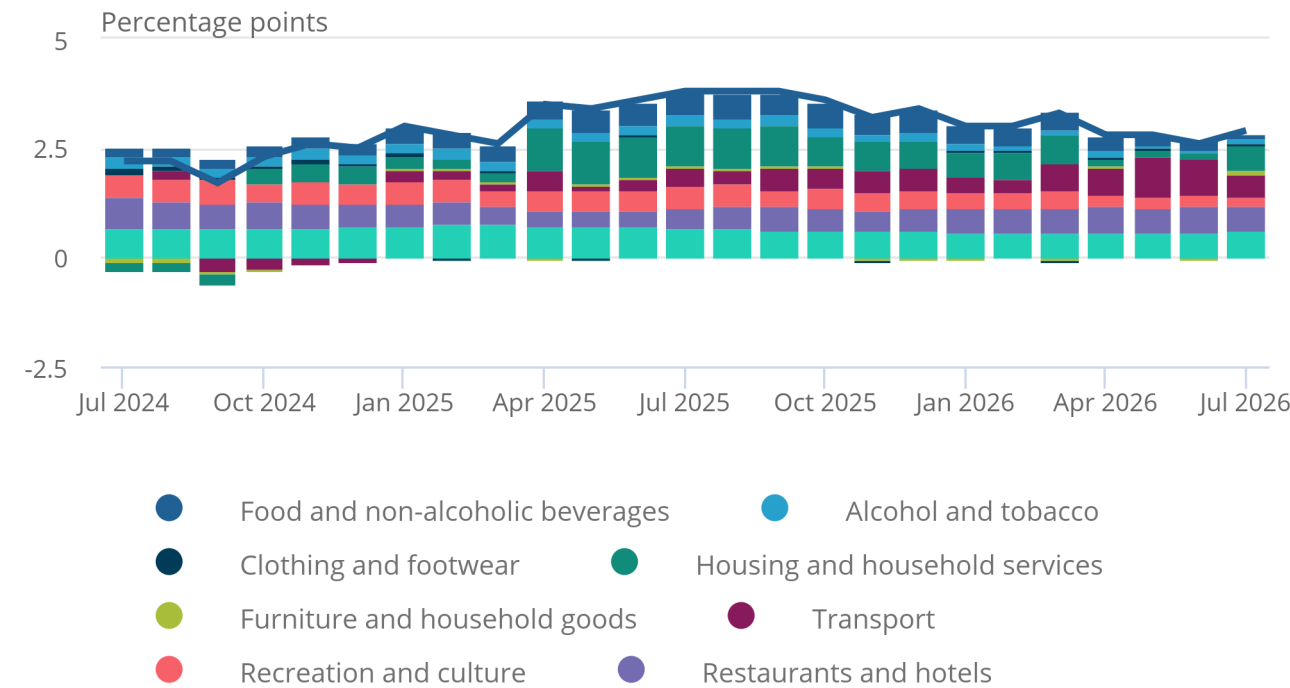
Though the sizes of the contributions differ from CPIH, the main drivers to the change are the same where they are common to both measures.

Figure 12 shows the extent to which the distinct categories of goods and services have contributed to the overall annual CPI inflation rate over the last two years.

The CPIH includes extra housing components not included in the CPI. This can sometimes result in the largest contributions to the annual CPI and CPIH inflation rates coming from different divisions. In July 2026, the largest contributing division to CPI was housing and household services (0.59 percentage point contribution to the CPI rate), which was also true for CPIH (1.26 percentage point contribution to the CPIH rate). OOH costs made a large upward contribution to housing and household services in CPIH, but these are excluded from CPI.

7 . Glossary

Annual inflation rate

The most common approach to measuring inflation is the 12-month or annual inflation rate, which compares prices for the latest month with the same month a year ago. In any given month, the annual rate is determined by the balance between upward and downward price movements across the range of goods and services included in the index.

Consumer price inflation

Consumer price inflation is the rate at which the prices of goods and services bought by households rise or fall. It is estimated by using price indices. For an overview of the range of indices available and their uses, please see our [Consumer price indices, a brief guide: 2026](#) and our [Measuring changing prices and costs for consumers and households: December 2023 article](#).

CPIH

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing (OOH) costs, along with Council Tax. Both are substantial expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

CPI

The CPI is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards, and is based on European regulations for the [Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices](#). The CPI is the inflation measure used in the government's target for inflation.

The CPI is produced at the same level of detail as the CPIH in our accompanying [Consumer price inflation dataset](#) and in our accompanying [Consumer price inflation time series](#).

Owner occupiers' housing costs

OOH costs are the costs of housing services associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home.

RPI

The Retail Prices Index (RPI) and its subcomponents do not meet the required standard for designation as [accredited official statistics](#). In recognition that the index continues to be widely used in contracts, we continue to publish the RPI, its subcomponents, and RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (RPIX). To view the all-items RPI, please see the [data time series section of the Inflation and price indices area of our website](#). The annual RPI inflation rate was 3.2% in July 2026.

The UK Statistics Authority (The Authority) and HM Treasury launched a consultation in 2020 on The Authority's proposal to address the shortcomings of the RPI. From 2030 (at the earliest), as outlined in [The Authority's response to the joint consultation on reforming the methodology of the Retail Prices Index](#), the CPIH methods and data sources will be introduced into the RPI. Additionally, the supplementary and lower-level indices of the RPI will be discontinued.

8 . Data sources and quality

Great British Summer Savings

The UK government's [Great British Summer Savings scheme](#), announced on 21 May 2026, took effect on 25 June. It is likely the scheme resulted in falls in prices for cultural events, historic monuments, and cinema admissions but it doesn't appear that it has had a substantial overall impact on headline consumer inflation.

Introducing scanner data into consumer price inflation statistics

We introduced scanner data for approximately 50% of the grocery market with the February 2026 index, published on 25 March 2026. Instead of collecting 25,000 prices per month directly from shops by price collectors, we are now using approximately 300 million price points derived from sales of over a billion units of products per month, collected directly from supermarket scanners at the checkouts or online. For the remaining 50% of the groceries market, we continue to manually collect prices in-store and online.

For comparison, we produced the all-items headline rates for February 2026 without using scanner data. Based on locally collected grocery data, the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) rose by 3.3% in the year to February 2026, and the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) rose by 3.1%. These were slightly above the official rates of 3.2% and 3.0%, respectively.

We also published our [Overview of how we use scanner data in consumer price inflation statistics: January 2026](#) and our [How multilateral index methods help us understand grocery scanner data article](#), which support user understanding of how we use the data.

Following the [Bank of England's response to the proposed changes to the Retail Prices Index \(RPI\) in 2026 \(PDF, 140KB\)](#), required under the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, this change was included in the RPI released in March 2026. It was also incorporated into the Household Costs Indices (HCIs) published on 28 May 2026.

This followed some changes introduced with the February 2025 consumer price indices in March 2025, as a necessary step towards incorporating scanner data. At that point, the process for aggregating the detailed information changed. Goods and services were allocated into "consumption segments" for different categories of expenditure.

In some cases, we defined these consumption segments to correspond to one "item" for which we track prices over time. However, in cases where more comprehensive source data were going to become available, a consumption segment was set up to include much more than just one item. There is more information on the use of consumption segments in our [Introducing alternative data into consumer price statistics: aggregation and weights article](#). For simplicity, we continue to refer to "items" in our statistical bulletin and detailed briefing note.

Changes to published microdata

Despite the benefits of introducing scanner data into the consumer price indices, we can no longer publish the price quote data for food and non-alcoholic beverages, alcohol and tobacco (Divisions 1 and 2 of the CPIH and CPI), or the equivalent categories of RPI in our [Consumer price inflation consumption segment indices and price quotes dataset](#). This is because of our data-sharing agreements with retailers.

Instead, we have developed new aggregate output statistics to meet the needs of users. We have improved the granularity and accuracy of our [Shopping prices comparison tool](#). We now provide average prices for more specific product types, such as "Microwave rice" and "Basmati rice". Under the previous, broader definitions (such as "rice, in all forms") we were unable to produce average prices. Units of measurement are also now included, making comparisons more meaningful and easier to interpret.

We are also publishing regional consumption segment indices and weights, and counts of indicator marker codes (for example, sales and recoveries) that are manually collected as part of the traditional data collection. We first published these from March 2026, with the release of the February 2026 indices. Further outputs will be introduced later in 2026.

Households and the cost of living

To assist individuals in understanding how the rise in inflation affects their expenditure, we have produced a [personal inflation calculator](#). The calculator allows users to enter the amount they spend across either a reduced or a wide range of categories, to produce an estimate of their personal inflation based on those spending patterns.

Our [Shopping prices comparison tool](#) shows how the average prices of items have changed over time. Please note that the newly introduced consumption segments for food, drink and tobacco will not have data before 2025 in the tool. However, the historical average prices for food, drink and tobacco items, that were in the tool before the update in 2025, can be found in our [Shopping prices comparison tool data download before the 2025 update](#).

Please also note that Table 55 in our historical [Consumer price inflation dataset](#), which provided time series of prices for petrol and diesel, has not been published since 19 February 2025, and the two series have been discontinued. Historical average prices are still available from the time series explorer function on our website, using the four-character identifiers CZMK for petrol and CZML for diesel.

On 28 May 2026, we published our quarterly [Household Costs Indices \(HCIs\) for UK household groups bulletin](#). The HCIs reflect how different types of households experience changing prices, and differ from CPIH and CPI. The CPIH and CPI are based on recognised economic principles and provide an aggregate measure of inflation for household spending in the UK.

The HCIs are [official statistics in development](#) and this release included new estimates for January to March 2026. This release uses updated 2025 weights. It has not been possible to update to 2026 weights in line with the standard methodology for consumer prices. This is because of delays in processing the underlying survey data and the need for further quality assurance. We will update the weights as soon as the data are available to use.

The latest HCI dataset also includes scanner data for the first time.

Passenger transport by air

A monthly index for passenger transport by air is included in the monthly consumer price inflation dataset. From March 2025, we also began publishing a set of subindices and weights on an annual basis. We updated our [Domestic, European and long-haul fares consumer prices subindices and weights dataset](#) on 25 March 2026 with data for March 2025 to February 2026, and a longer historical time series back to 2007. From March 2026, we have also started to release [quarterly and annual average air fares](#), again on an annual basis. The analyses are released in [the user requested data section of our website](#).

Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose

The Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP) is the classification that underpins some of the main statistics that we produce. To reflect changes in household expenditure patterns since its inception in the late 1990s, the [classification was updated in 2018 \(PDF, 1.286KB\)](#).

The UK currently uses the [version of COICOP introduced in 1999, which was updated in 2017](#) to add additional detail at the subclass level. However, we plan to have implemented the updated COICOP 2018 by 2029, as referenced in [Section B4 of our Economic statistics plan](#) and [Section 5 of our Economic statistics progress report](#). We will also consider re-referencing the CPI as part of the move to the new classification and will provide users with full details of our plans, once finalised.

Weights for 2026 consumer price inflation statistics

In line with usual practice at the start of each year, the expenditure weights used in compiling the CPIH and CPI were calculated using updated spending information. The first update of weights was implemented with the January indices. The second update was introduced, along with the usual basket update, with the February indices released in March. We published our [Consumer price inflation, updating weights: 2026 article](#) and our [Consumer price inflation basket of goods and services: 2026 article](#) on 16 March 2026.

The 2026 weights for CPIH and CPI were calculated using national accounts household final consumption expenditure (HHFCE) data for 2024. They reflect our most comprehensive and complete estimate of the latest household spending at the time of the weights update. This is in line with our standard methodology. More information is available in our [Consumer price inflation, updating weights articles](#).

The weights for the RPI were also updated and introduced with the February 2026 index.

Consumer price inflation historical estimates, UK, 1950 to 1988

On 18 May 2022, we published our [Consumer price inflation, historical estimates, UK, 1950 to 1988 - methodology](#) and our [Consumer price inflation, historical estimates and recent trends, UK: 1950 to 2022 article](#). These include new estimates of CPIH and improved estimates of CPI for 1950 to 1988. These estimates (published in response to user need for a longer series) are indicative and are for analytical purposes only. They are not intended for official use and do not constitute part of the [accredited official statistics](#) series.

Previously, in December 2018, we published our [Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs \(CPIH\) historical series: 1988 to 2004 article](#). These series are also not classed as accredited official statistics, reflecting the historical uncertainty around the backcasts.

Methodology information

The consumer price indices are based on prices collected manually from outlets around the country, information collected centrally over the internet and by phone, and, from February 2026, data collected from supermarket scanners at the checkouts or online. The traditionally sourced data used in this release were collected on or around 14 July 2026.

Strengths and limitations

In our [Measuring changing prices and costs for consumers and households article](#), we illustrated our approach to the process using three "use cases" and described how they relate to the measures published and under development.

The three cases refer firstly to the CPIH as our lead measure of inflation, based on economic principles. They also refer to the HCIs as a set of measures that reflect the change in costs and prices experienced by different households, and the RPI as a legacy measure that is required to meet existing user needs. The issues with the RPI are described in our [Shortcomings of the Retail Prices Index as a measure of inflation article](#).

Accredited official statistics

These [accredited official statistics](#) were independently reviewed by the Office for Statistics Regulation in July 2017. They comply with the standards of trustworthiness, quality and value in the [Code of Practice for Statistics](#) and should be labelled "accredited official statistics".

Revisions and correction of errors policies for consumer price inflation statistics
