Recorded Crime in Scotland, 2013-14 - publication date

Recorded Crime in Scotland 2013-14 was initially scheduled for publication in June 2014. However the publication date for these statistics has been reviewed and, as has happened in previous years, will now be published in the Autumn, to allow quality assurance, analysis and report writing to take place over the summer. This will ensure that the analysis and structure of the report reflect the new policing arrangements since the inception of Police Scotland and the report communicates the statistics in a way that is clear, accessible and helpful to all users.

We intend to publish the recorded crime statistics for 2013-14 in October 2014. We will provide an update to ScotStat users when the exact date of publication of the statistical bulletin has been confirmed.
