



Thanks very much for including myself and **sector** in the round-table. I found it very interesting.

I was struck by a couple of people referring to sex as a protected characteristic. In discrimination law, the terms man and woman, which are identified as the protected characteristic of sex are broader than 'birth sex'.

They also include discrimination where someone assumes you are a member of the 'sex' category regardless of whether you actually are, and discriminates against you as a result.

So, the use of sex in equality law might be something to draw on if you want to standardise a 'lived' conception of binary sex,


