Consumer Price Inflation April 2018

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This note is produced as background briefing for the Consumer Price Inflation Statistical Bulletin. Users who require authoritative figures should use the Consumer Price Inflation Statistical Bulletin or Consumer Price Inflation Dataset.



SUMMARY

CPIH

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with council tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and council tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and council tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

The <u>National Statistics</u> status of the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) was reinstated on 31 July 2017. <u>A letter</u> from the Director General for Regulation to the National Statistician detailed the actions that were taken to meet the requirements as set out in the <u>CPIH</u> assessment report.

The main movements for CPIH in April 2018 are:

- The all items CPIH is 105.5, up from 105.1 in March.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 2.2%, down from 2.3% in March.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 2.1%, down from 2.2% last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 105.3, up from 105.2 in March.
- The OOH component annual rate is 1.2%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 103.8, up from 103.7 in March.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 2.6%, up from 2.4% last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 106.8, up from 106.1 in March.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 1.9%, down from 2.1% last month.

Consumer Prices Index (CPI)

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the



Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.

The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in April 2018 are:

- The all items CPI is 105.4, up from 105.0 in March.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 2.4%, down from 2.5% in March.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 2.4%, down from 2.5% last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 2.3%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 103.8, up from 103.7 in March.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 2.6%, up from 2.4% last month.
- The CPI all services index is 107.2, up from 106.5 in March.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.1%, down from 2.5% last month.

Retail Prices Index (RPI)

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> <u>assessment report</u> can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in April 2018 are:

- The all items RPI is 279.7, up from 278.3 in March.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 3.4%, up from 3.3% last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs), is 3.4%, unchanged from last month.
- The all goods RPI is 212.8, up from 212.4 in March.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 3.6%, up from 3.2% last month.
- The all services RPI is 380.2, up from 378.0 in March.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 2.9%, down from 3.5% last month.

Large downward effects came from:

• Transport, principally from air fares. The timing of Easter in the middle of April 2017 contributed to air fares rising by 18.6% on the month whereas this year, Easter fell at the beginning of April before the price collection period and there was no price rise. Instead, fares fell slightly, by 0.2%, between March and April. Within the transport category, the downward contribution from air fares was partially offset by an upward effect from motor fuels. Petrol prices rose by 1.5 pence per litre between March and April 2018 to stand at 120.7 pence per litre in April. This compares with a 1.8 pence per litre fall between the same two months of 2017 to stand at 117.4 pence per litre in April 2017. Similarly, diesel



- prices rose by 1.6 pence per litre between March and April this year compared with a 1.8 pence per litre fall a year ago; and
- Clothing and footwear, with prices rising by 0.4% between March and April 2018 compared with a larger rise of 1.1% between the same two months a year earlier. The effect came mainly from men's clothing.

A small downward effect came from:

• Food and non-alcoholic beverages. This was from a range of food products with the largest single effect from meat, where prices fell this year but rose a year ago, particularly for cooked ham. The downward contribution from food was partially offset by an upward effect from mineral waters, soft drinks and juices, where prices rose by 2.8% between March and April this year compared with a rise of 0.3% a year ago. Most of this effect came from products affected by the introduction of the Soft Drinks Industry Levy or "Sugar Tax", such as colas and energy drinks. 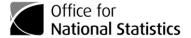
A small upward effect came from:

• **Communication**, where prices of telephone equipment and services rose by 0.4% this year compared with a fall of 1.0% a year ago. The contribution came almost entirely from bundled communication services.

Bread and cereals

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, with the main downward contributions coming from packs of individual cakes and dried potted snacks.
- Partially offset by a small upward contribution from chocolate biscuits, where prices rose this
 year but fell a year ago.

Meat

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, particularly for pre-packed cooked ham.

Fish

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago, particularly for frozen prawns.
- Partially offset by a small downward contribution coming from frozen fish fingers, where
 prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

Milk, cheese and eggs

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year by more than a year ago, with the main downward contribution coming from yoghurt/fromage frais.

Oils and fats

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year by less than a year ago, particularly for margarine/low fat spread.

Fruit

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year by more than a year ago, particularly for strawberries.

Vegetables including potatoes

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, particularly for premium potato crisps and frozen chips.



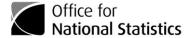

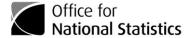

RECONCILIATION OF CPI AND RPI

(Table 5 of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPI and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPI, other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final column titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

This table currently compares CPI with RPI. In due course it will be updated to compare CPIH with RPI.

The difference between the CPI and RPI unrounded annual rates in April 2018 was -0.96 percentage points, widening from -0.87 percentage points in March 2018.

The main factors contributing to the widening were:

- Other housing components excluded from the CPI, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPI 12-month rate by 0.11 percentage points between March and April 2018. The effect came mainly from house depreciation and council tax.
- The formula effect, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPI 12-month
 rate by 0.05 percentage points between March and April 2018. The effect came mainly
 from food and non-alcoholic beverages; and recreation and culture. This was partially offset
 by clothing and footwear.

The main offsetting factor was:

Other differences including weights, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate relative to
the CPI 12-month rate by 0.08 percentage points between March and April 2018. The effect
came mainly from air fares; games, toys and hobbies and equipment for sport and open-air
recreation; and insurance. This was partially offset by clothing and footwear; fuels and
lubricants; and sea fares.

HOUSING, WATER, ELECTRICITY, GAS AND OTHER FUELS

Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels

- British Gas has announced an increase in their default standard variable tariff (SVT) from 29 May 2018. The price for a typical dual fuel customer on this tariff will go up on average by £60 to £1,161 £30 for gas and £30 for electricity. (britishgas.co.uk 10 April 2018)
- EDF Energy has announced a change to its standard variable electricity tariff, effective from



7 June 2018. EDF Energy's standard variable dual fuel Direct Debit tariff will increase by 1.4% to £1,158 a year following an increase in the standing charge for electricity to 23.28p a day, an increase of 2.7% on a typical electricity bill. There will be no change to gas prices for Direct Debit customers. There will also be an increase in the charges for customers choosing to pay by cash or cheque by £6 per fuel per year, applying to standard variable tariffs and future fixed tariffs. A dual fuel standard variable customer choosing to pay by cash or cheque will see a combined increase of £28 a year (+2.3%) to £1,248 a year. (edfenergy.com 12 April 2018)

Npower has announced a change to its Standard Variable and Juice tariffs. From 17 June
the cost of a typical dual fuel energy bill will be going up by 5.3%, or £64 a year on average.
Gas prices will go up by an average of 4.4%. Electricity prices will go up by an average of
6.2%. (npower.com 11 May 2018)

TRANSPORT

Fuels and Lubricants

- The oil price is hovering at a three-and-a-half-year high today with Brent crude currently at \$79.22 a barrel. Planned US sanctions against Iran and tighter production restrictions instigated by oil cartel Opec have helped drive oil prices up by more than 70% over the past year. (bbc.co.uk 15 May 2018)
- When considering the price of petrol between April and May 2018, it may be useful to note that the average price of petrol fell by 1.0 pence per litre between April and May 2017, standing at 116.4 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately
 0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.



Passenger Transport by Air

Air fares tend to rise in May, but this can depend on the position of Easter.

HOUSING (RPI)

Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.5% on Thursday 10 May 2018.
 The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy
 Committee are scheduled to be published on 21 June 2018.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was negligible between April and May 2017. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.25% in April 2017.
- A one percentage point change in the average mortgage interest rate contributes approximately 1.0 percentage points to the 1-month percentage change in the RPI.



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
