SUMMARY

CPIH

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with council tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and council tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and council tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

The <u>National Statistics</u> status of the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) was reinstated on 31 July 2017. <u>A letter</u> from the Director General for Regulation to the National Statistician detailed the actions that were taken to meet the requirements as set out in the <u>CPIH</u> assessment report.

The main movements for CPIH in August 2018 are:

- The all items CPIH is 106.5, up from 105.9 in July.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 2.4%, up from 2.3% in July.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 2.3%, up from 2.2% last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 105.7, up from 105.6 in July.
- The OOH component annual rate is 1.0%, down from 1.1% last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 104.1, up from 103.3 in July.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 2.7%, up from 2.6% last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 108.3, up from 107.7 in July.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 2.2%, up from 2.0% last month.

Consumer Prices Index (CPI)

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.



The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in August 2018 are:

- The all items CPI is 106.5, up from 105.8 in July.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 2.7%, up from 2.5% in July.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 2.7%, up from 2.5% last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 2.6%, up from 2.4% last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 104.1, up from 103.3 in July.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 2.8%, up from 2.6% last month.
- The CPI all services index is 109.2, up from 108.5 in July.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.5%, up from 2.3% last month.


Retail Prices Index (RPI)

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> assessment report can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in August 2018 are:

- The all items RPI is 284.2, up from 281.7 in July.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 3.5%, up from 3.2% last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs), is 3.4%, up from 3.3% last month.
- The all goods RPI is 213.9, up from 212.2 in July.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 3.7%, up from 3.6% last month.
- The all services RPI is 391.3, up from 387.7 in July.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 3.1%, up from 2.9% last month.

Large upward effects came from:

- Recreation and culture, where prices rose by 0.6% between July and August 2018 compared with a smaller rise of 0.1% between the same two months a year ago. The main effects came from cultural services, where theatre admission prices rose by more than a year ago, and games, toys and hobbies, where prices for computer games rose this year but fell a year ago. These games are heavily dependent on the composition of bestseller charts, often resulting in large overall price changes from month to month;
- **Transport**, with passenger transport fares showing larger price rises between July and August 2018 than between the same two months a year ago. The effect came from a combination of sea and air fares. Within transport, these effects were partially offset by a



small downward contribution from motor fuels. Petrol prices rose by 1.4 pence per litre between July and August 2018 compared with a larger rise of 1.8 pence per litre between July and August 2017. Similarly, diesel rose by 1.2 pence this year compared with 2.0 pence a year ago; and

• Clothing and footwear, with average prices rising by 3.1% between July and August 2018 compared with a smaller rise of 2.4% between the same two months a year ago. Prices of clothing and footwear usually rise between July and August as autumn ranges start to enter the shops following the summer sales season. The rise was larger this year than in 2017 and may have been influenced by the proportion of items on sale, which fell by more between July and August this year than between the same two months a year ago. The upward effect came principally from women's and children's clothing.

Small upward effects came from:

- Miscellaneous goods and services, where prices overall rose by 0.6% between July and August 2018 compared with a smaller rise of 0.3% between the same two months in 2017; and
- Alcoholic beverages and tobacco, where prices overall rose by 0.6% this year compared with a smaller rise of 0.1% a year ago.


Small downward effects came from:

- Furniture, household equipment and maintenance, where prices rose by 1.2% between July and August 2018 compared with 1.8% in 2017. The effect was widespread across most subcategories; and
- Communication, with prices rising by less than a year ago. The main downward contributions came from mobile phone charges and bundled telecommunication services.

Bread and cereals

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, with the main downward contribution coming from bread.
- Partially offset by a small upward contribution from chocolate biscuits, where prices overall
 rose this year but fell a year ago.

Oils and fats

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, particularly for margarine/low fat spread.

Vegetables including potatoes

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago, with the main upward contribution coming from potato crisps.

Sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by more than a year ago, with the main upward contributions coming from chocolate covered ice cream bars and cartons/boxes of chocolates.
- Partially offset by a small downward contribution coming from bags of chocolates, where
 prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

Food products not elsewhere covered

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year by less than a year ago.

- Partially offset by small downward contributions coming from women's jackets, cardigans and formal trousers; girls' fashion tops and men's T-shirts.

Other clothing and clothing accessories

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago, particularly for ladies' scarves.



- Small upward effect on the all items 12-month rate change.
- Prices overall rose this year by more than a year ago, with the main upward contribution coming from women's sandals.





Fuels and lubricants

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by less than a year ago.
- The average price of petrol across the month, as recorded for the CPIH, rose by 1.4 pence per litre between July and August 2018, to stand at 128.6 pence per litre.
- Last year, the average price of petrol rose by 1.8 pence per litre between July and August 2017, to stand at 115.7 pence per litre.
- The average price of diesel rose by 1.2 pence per litre between July and August 2018 to stand at 132.8 pence per litre, compared with a larger rise of 2.0 pence per litre a year earlier, to stand at 117.6 pence per litre.

RECONCILIATION OF CPI AND RPI

(Table 5 of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPI and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPI, other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final column titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

This table currently compares CPI with RPI. In due course it will be updated to compare CPIH with RPI.

The difference between the CPI and RPI unrounded annual rates in August 2018 was -0.80 percentage points, widening from -0.76 percentage points in July 2018.

The main factors contributing to the widening were:

- Mortgage Interest Payments, which increased the RPI 12-month rate by 0.07 percentage points between July and August 2018 but are excluded from the CPI.
- Other housing components, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPI
 12-month rate by 0.02 percentage points between July and August 2018. The effect came
 mainly from house depreciation.

The main offsetting factor was:

Other differences including weights, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate relative to
the CPI 12-month rate by 0.04 percentage points between July and August 2018. The
effect came mainly from sea fares; and clothing and footwear. This was partially offset by
furniture and furnishings, carpets and household textiles.



FOOD

HOUSING, WATER, ELECTRICITY, GAS AND OTHER FUELS

Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels

 E.ON has announced that it is increasing its standard variable electricity and gas prices. On 16 August, the unit price of E.ON's standard variable tariff will increase by an average of 4.8% or £55 for customers taking both fuels, 6.2% or £36 for electricity only customers and 3.3% or £19 for gas only customers. (eonenergy.com 19 June 2018)



- EDF Energy has announced a change to its standard variable tariff prices, effective from 31
 August 2018. EDF Energy's standard variable dual fuel tariff will increase by 6% to £1,228 a
 year. The standard variable electricity and gas tariffs will be increasing by 6.1% and 6%
 respectively. (edfenergy.com 5 July 2018)
- British Gas has announced a 3.8% increase in its standard variable tariff (SVT), with effect from 1 October. The average bill will rise by £44 to £1,205 a year. (britishgas.co.uk 8 August 2018)
- ScottishPower has announced its domestic standard variable gas and electricity prices are to increase from 8 October 2018. Standard dual fuel prices will increase by an average of 3.7%. (scottishpower.co.uk 24 August 2018)

TRANSPORT

Fuels and Lubricants

- Oil prices have held steady as market participants weighed potential supply cuts from U.S. sanctions on Iran with deepening trade tensions between the United States and China that could dent global crude demand. Brent crude futures rose 13 cents to \$78.22 a barrel, while U.S. West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude futures fell 8 cents to \$68.91 a barrel. (uk.reuters.com 17 September 2018)
- When considering the price of petrol between August and September 2018, it may be useful
 to note that the average price of petrol rose by 2.5 pence per litre between August and
 September 2017, to stand at 118.2 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately
 0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.

HOUSING (RPI)

Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.75% on Thursday 13 September 2018. The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy Committee are scheduled to be published on 1 November 2018.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was -0.01 percentage points between August and September 2017. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.25% in August 2017.
- A one percentage point change in the average mortgage interest rate contributes approximately 1.0 percentage points to the 1-month percentage change in the RPI.



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
