SUMMARY

<u>CPIH</u>

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with Council Tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and Council Tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and Council Tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

The <u>National Statistics</u> status of the CPIH was reinstated on 31 July 2017. <u>A letter</u> from the Director General for Regulation to the National Statistician detailed the actions that were taken to meet the requirements as set out in the <u>CPIH assessment report</u>.

The main movements for CPIH in July 2019 are:

- The all items CPIH is 108.0, up from 107.9 in June.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 2.0%, up from 1.9% in June.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 1.9%, up from 1.8% last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 106.8, up from 106.7 in June.
- The OOH component annual rate is 1.2%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 105.1, down from 105.5 in June.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 1.7%, up from 1.5% last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 110.1, up from 109.7 in June.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 2.2%, unchanged from last month.

Consumer Prices Index (CPI)

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.



The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in July 2019 are:

- The all items CPI is 107.9, unchanged from last month.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 2.1%, up from 2.0% in June.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 2.1%, up from 2.0% last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 2.0%, up from 1.9% last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 105.1, down from 105.5 in June.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 1.7%, up from 1.5% last month.
- The CPI all services index is 111.2, up from 110.6 in June.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.5%, unchanged from last month.

Retail Prices Index (RPI)

<u>An error was identified</u> in the dataset underpinning the 2019 RPI weights covering the period February to June 2019. In line with the consumer price inflation statistics <u>revisions</u> <u>policy</u> RPI has not been revised. The corrected weights have been used in July 2019 RPI onwards. Users should note there will be a discontinuity between June's and July's index levels, which have been calculated using differing weights.

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> <u>assessment report</u> can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer</u> <u>price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in July 2019 are:

- The all items RPI is 289.5, down from 289.6 in June.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 2.8%, down from 2.9% last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs), is 2.7%, down from 2.8% last month.
- The all goods RPI is 216.8, down from 218.3 in June.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 2.2%, up from 2.0% last month.



- The all services RPI is 401.3, up from 399.0 in June.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 3.5%, down from 4.0% last month.

Large upward effects came from:

- Recreation and culture, where within this group, the largest effect came from games, toys and hobbies (in particular from computer games and consoles) where prices overall rose by 8.4% between June and July 2019 compared with a rise of 4.1% between the same two months a year ago. Price movements for these items can often be relatively large depending on the composition of bestseller charts and the upward contribution between the latest two months follows a downward contribution, from computer games purchased online and games consoles, between May and June 2019;
- **Restaurants and hotels**, with prices for accommodation services (particularly overnight hotel accommodation) rising by 3.1% between June and July this year compared with a 0.5% rise a year ago;



- **Clothing and footwear**, with prices falling by 2.9% between June and July 2019 compared with a larger fall of 3.7% between the same two months in 2018. The main upward effects came from footwear including repairs and garments; and
- **Miscellaneous goods and services**, where prices rose by 0.6% between June and July 2019 but fell by 4.2% between the same two months a year ago. The main upward effects came from banking services (not elsewhere covered), following the removal of initial charges for investment in some unit trusts in 2018.

Large downward effects came from:

- **Transport**, the price of transport services (particularly from air, international rail and sea fares) rose by 2.6% between June and July this year compared with a larger rise of 6.1% between the same two months a year ago. A smaller downward effect came from the operation of personal transport equipment where diesel pump prices fell by 2.3 pence per litre this year, to stand at 132.0 pence per litre, compared with a fall of 0.5 pence per litre a year ago. Petrol prices had little effect on the change in the 12-month rate where they fell by 0.9 pence per litre between June and July 2019, to stand at an average price of 127.3 pence per litre, compared with a fall of 0.8 pence per litre a year ago. There were further small downward contributions from the cost of car hire, repairs and roadside recovery which were partially offset by a small upward effect from second-hand cars; and
- Housing and household services, with prices rising by 0.1% between June and July 2019 compared with a larger rise of 0.2% between the same two months a year ago. Within this broad category, the downward effect came from electricity, gas and other fuels where prices overall rose by 1.3% last year but were little changed between June and July 2019.

Small downward effects came from:

- Food and non-alcoholic beverages, where prices rose by 0.1% between June and July 2019 but rose by 0.3% between the same two months a year ago. The downward movements came from milk, cheese and eggs; mineral waters, soft drinks and juices; meat; and sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery, partially offset by small upward contributions from fish; and vegetables;
- **Furniture, household equipment and maintenance**, where prices overall fell by 1.7% between June and July 2019 compared with a fall of 1.8% between the same two months a year ago; and
- **Communication**, where prices rose by 0.5% between June and July 2018 but were unchanged this year.

Vegetables including potatoes

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago, particularly for premium potato crisps.
 Partially offset by a small downward contribution coming from multi-packs of potato crisps, where prices fell this year but rose a year ago.

Sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, with the main downward contribution coming from cartons/boxes of chocolates. Partially offset by a small upward contribution coming from chocolate covered ice cream bars, where prices rose this year but fell a year ago.



RPI DETAILED BRIEFING

<u>An error was identified</u> in the dataset underpinning the 2019 RPI weights covering the period February to June 2019. In line with the consumer price inflation statistics <u>revisions</u> <u>policy</u> RPI has not been revised. The corrected weights have been used in July 2019 RPI onwards. Users should note there will be a discontinuity between June's and July's index levels, which have been calculated using differing weights.

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. A consultation was carried out in March 2013 on whether to maintain this detailed RPI briefing and, based on views received, it was decided to continue with its publication.

RECONCILIATION OF CPIH AND RPI

(Table 5a of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPIH and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPIH, imputed rents (included in CPIH and excluded from RPI), other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final component titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

The corresponding figures for the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) can be found in Table 5b of the Consumer price inflation dataset.

The difference between the CPIH and RPI unrounded annual rates in July 2019 was -0.80 percentage points, narrowing from -0.95 percentage points in June 2019.

The main factors contributing to the narrowing were:

- Other differences including weights, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPIH 12-month rate by 0.13 percentage points between June and July 2019. The effect came mainly from games, toys and hobbies and equipment for sport and open-air recreation; air fares; and fuels and lubricants. This was partially offset by widening effects from sea fares; furniture and furnishings, carpets and household textiles; second-hand cars; and recording media.
- Other differences in coverage of goods and services, which decreased the RPI 12month rate relative to the CPIH 12-month rate by 0.04 percentage points between June and July 2019. The effect came mainly from financial services.

The main offsetting factor was:

• Other housing components, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPIH 12-month rate by 0.02 percentage points between June and July 2019. The effect came mainly from house depreciation.

TRANSPORT

Fuels and Lubricants

- Oil prices have slumped again this morning on renewed global economic growth concerns after President Trump threatened to escalate the China trade war. Brent crude is down 1.32% at \$61.07 a barrel. (bbc.co.uk 12 August 2019)
- When considering the price of petrol between July and August 2019, it may be useful to note that the average price of petrol rose by 1.4 pence per litre between July and August 2018, to stand at 128.6 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately 0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.

HOUSING (RPI)

Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.75% on Thursday 1 August 2019.
 The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy
 Committee are scheduled to be published on 19 September 2019.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was +0.06 percentage points between July and August 2018. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.5% in July 2018.
- A one percentage point change in the average mortgage interest rate contributes approximately 1.0 percentage points to the 1-month percentage change in the RPI.
